Baptisms: Please call the rectory to arrange the celebration of Baptism. Baptisms ordinarily should not take place during Lent except in case of emergency. (Feb. 14th - March 30th, 2024)

Marriages: Reserve and register date & time as soon as possible, at least six months in advance of the wedding. Pre-Cana and other instructional sessions are required for all couples.

Sponsor letters: Church law requires sponsors to be active, registered Catholics and live according to Church teaching

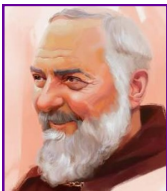

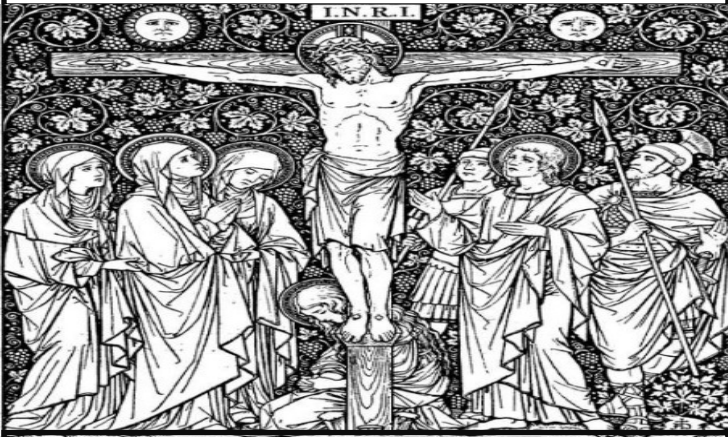

Prayer for Vocations

O JESUS, ETERNAL HIGH PRIEST, I offer Thee through Thine Immaculate Mother Mary, Thine own Precious Blood, in all the Masses throughout the world, as petition for graces for all priests and seminarians.

We come to Thee with great confidence as our Eternal High Priest and Immaculate Victim and we humbly beseech Thee: send many holy priests and oblates into Thy harvest, and protect and strengthen the vocations which Thou has called.

Give them humility, meekness, prudence, and a burning zeal for souls. Fill their hearts with the gifts of the Holy Ghost. Teach them to know and love the Church, which thou hast entrusted the Archangel Michael to defend. May they always and everywhere speak, act, and think with her, the glorious spouse of Christ.

Teach them generosity and detachment from worldly goods; but above all, teach them to know Thee and to love the One and Only Eternal Priest, good Shepherd of Souls. Amen.

Lenten Regulations

During the season of Lent, the Church urges the faithful to reflect a spirit of penance in their daily lives through performing acts of fast and abstinence.

- Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14, and ends on the evening of Holy Thursday, March 28.
- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting and abstinence. This is a serious matter within Church law.
- Fasting means only one full meal a day may be taken. Two smaller meals may be eaten to maintain physical strength but together they should not equal another full meal in quantity. Snacking between meals is not permitted.
- Catholics ages 18-59 are obligated to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are not specifically obliged to fast are encouraged to join in the discipline of fasting to the extent that they are able.
- Abstinence forbids the eating of meat or poultry. Those who have reached the age of 14 and older are obligated to abstain on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. Those who are not specifically obliged to abstain from eating meat are urged to join in the discipline of abstaining to the extent that they are able.

All Fridays of the year are designated as days of penance during which we are encouraged to practice self-denial out of gratitude for the suffering and death Jesus accepted for us.
