Feast of the Transfiguration August 6th

In the New Testament, the occasion upon which Jesus Christ took three of His disciples, Peter, James & John, up on a mountain, where Moses and Elijah appeared and Jesus was transfigured, His face and clothes becoming dazzling bright. The transfiguration is recorded in all three of the synoptic Gospels (Mark 9:2-13: Matthew 17:1-13: Luke 9: 28-36) and is understood to have been the revelation of the eternal glory of the second person of the Blessed Trinity, which is normally veiled during Christs life on Earth.



From the desk of Fr. Saffron:

Votive Candles and the Sanctuary Candle.

Throughout the church, you will notice red globe candles. They are near the various statues and icons in our church.

For years, people have complained about electric candles. They were switched out with real candles about a month ago. The price for offering one of these candles is in the bulletin and can be done over the phone or by visiting the office.

But why light a candle? Well, when we light a candle in church, it is a sign of our desire to pray. And to keep that prayer before the Lord or a saint as we move on with our day. For example, the votives we offer burn for eight days.

The candle is made of wax, which, while it burns, offers it's self up as a sacrifice to God. This is a reminder that we should be doing the same with our lives. Every action, thought, word, and deed of our day should be offered to Almighty God.

The candle should never be lit without an offering of a prayer.

The small votives work the same, they simple burn for less time. Ideally, if you are coming to Mass, the votive should be lit before Mass, so that while you offer your prayers during Mass, the candle is burning as an offering in symbolism of your prayer. Most of us light candles before leaving church, but the more orthodox practice is to light them before Mass.

The electric candles do not offer this simple act of giving like a real candle.

The Sanctuary lamp/candle can be either red or clear glass. Clear is actually more traditional, but red is more popular. The use of this candle comes from the practice that whenever the priest opened the tabernacle to handle the Most Blessed Sacrament, a candle had to be lit. Over time, the practice became to leave a perpetual flame before the Blessed Sacrament so that all would know that Our Lord is present in the tabernacle. Before the candle was more common, the tabernacle veil was/is the symbol of Our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament being present. The candle we use burns for 14 days.

One of the little house jobs I do weekly is to light the votives for the week and change the Sanctuary candle every two weeks. I take this job seriously and don't usually "just get it done." I usually line up all the candles, light them, and bless the intentions. I read the list in the bulletin and bless your intentions while lighting the candles and placing them around the church.

I will begin next weekend not lighting a candle before images that have not been sponsored. So, for example, the candle near the Holy Face can be offered for the Holy Face, Infant of Prague, Our Lady of Perpetual Help; all those images are in the same area. If it has not been offered, I won't light one. The exceptions are the candles before Mary and the Sacred Heart have been offered for the year. St. Josaphat will always have one since he is our patron. And of course, the Sanctuary Lamp.

Remember, candles can be lit for the living and faithful departed. And maybe every now and then, you might light a small votive for me and keep me in your prayers.
