LENTEN REGULATIONS

FASTING: Catholics **ages 18 through 59** are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and **GOOD FRIDAY**. Fasting means **one full meal** and two smaller meals which, if added together, do not equal a full meal. It is not permitted to eat between these meals.

ABSTINENCE: On Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent, **all Catholics 14 years old and older** are obliged to abstain **from meat** and anything made from meat (but not eggs or dairy). On these days in Lent, it is not allowed to substitute the obligation to abstain from meat by a different penance.

EXCEPTIONS: Besides those outside the age limits, those of unsound mind, the sick, the frail, pregnant or nursing women according to need for meat or nourishment, are excused from the law of fast and abstinence. The same holds true for the poor who have nothing else to eat that day.

CHILDREN: Children can be invited to **abstain voluntarily** from meat on those days of penance as an expression of self-denial and of their love for the Crucified Christ. **Before** the new regulations concerning fasting and abstinence were promulgated by *Pope Paul VI* (Apostolic Constitution *Paenitemini*, Feb. 17, 1966), the **obligation** of abstinence **began at** the age of reason—**7 years old**.

ENCOURAGEMENT: Aside from these minimum penitential requirements by canon law, Catholics are encouraged to self-impose **some personal penance**: *additional prayer time, almsgiving, fasting, spiritual or corporal works of mercy, mortification of one's pride and self-love, forgiving past offenses, not holding resentment, and giving up some comfort or permitted pleasure or pastime.*

BEFORE ALL ELSE, we are obliged to **perform the duties of our state in life**. When considering further mortifications, it is prudent to discuss the matter with one's spiritual director or confessor. Any deprivation that would seriously hinder us in carrying out our duties as priests, parents, students, employees, etc., would be contrary to the will of God.

EASTER BASKET

All contents need to be **covered with a piece of fabric** and in a **wicker basket**.

It can be filled with:

decorated hardboiled eggs ; (lamb-shaped) butter or sugar; bread (Jesus, "Bread of Life"); meats, such as ham, sausage, smoked bacon, or lamb ("Lamb of God"); salt (symbol of Truth & justice); cheese ; horseradish, pepper, oil, and vinegar (symbolic of the Passion of Christ and the bitter herbs of the Passover); and wine (symbolic of the Blood of the Lord).

CHURCH SECURITY: Once the church doors have been locked, please exit only through the side doors toward the front (near the altar). Please do not use the vestibule doors after lock-up. Some vestibule doors do not close by themselves and may be left partially open.

MASS INTENTIONS: To request the celebration of a Holy Mass for your intention, please come to the rectory or place the Mass intention request envelope (available in the back of the church) into the collection basket.

Without worrying about making perfect sense of everything or following along word-for-word in your missal or booklet, rather enjoy the beauty of this liturgy, which has produced countless generations of saints and in actuality defines and governs the life of our Institute and all its members: priest-canons, seminarians, oblates, and Sister Adorers.

In keeping with liturgical tradition in the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite, Holy Communion is received on the tongue and, if you are able, kneeling. Visitors who are not Roman Catholic are welcome to join us in prayer, but are requested not to receive Holy Communion. Because the reception of Holy Communion is the expression of complete union with God and His Church, only practicing Catholics who are in full communion with the Catholic Church and free from mortal sin should present themselves to receive. We pray for the full, visible unity of all Christians.

ORGANIZATIONS AT THE ORATORY

THE CARMELITE OBLATES meet on the first Saturday of every month, after Holy Mass, and host a public Holy Face Devotion on the third Sunday of every month at 3:00 pm in the Oratory.
