PROPERs – 3RD SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST



*The Good Shepherd, 3rd century
Catacombs of St. Callixtus, Appian Way, Rome*

Introit: *Ps. 24:16, 18.* Look Thou upon me, and have mercy on me, O Lord; for I am alone and poor. See my abjection and my labour, and forgive me all my sins, O my God. *Ps. 24:1-2.* To Thee, O Lord, have I lifted up my soul: in Thee, O my God, I put my trust; let me not be ashamed. Glory be.

Collect: O God, the protector of all that trust in Thee, without whom nothing is strong, nothing is holy: multiply Thy mercy upon us; that, Thou being our ruler and guide, we may so pass through the good things temporal, that we lose not those that are eternal. Through our Lord.

Epistle: *I Peter 5:6-11.* Dearly beloved, Be you humbled under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in the time of visitation: casting all your care upon Him, for He hath care of you. Be sober and watch: because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, goeth about seeking whom he may devour. Whom resist ye, strong in faith: knowing that the same affliction befalleth your brethren who are in the world. But the God of all grace, Who hath called us unto His eternal glory in Christ Jesus, after you have suffered a

little, will Himself perfect you, and confirm you, and establish you. To Him be glory and empire for ever and ever. Amen.

Gradual: *Ps. 54:23, 17, 19.* Cast thy care upon the Lord, and He shall sustain thee. *V.* When I cried to the Lord, He heard my voice, from them that draw near to me.

Alleluia: Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* *Ps. 7:12.* God is a just judge, strong and patient; is He angry every day? Alleluia.

Gospel: *Luke 15:1-10.* At that time, the publicans and sinners drew near unto Jesus to hear Him. And the Pharisees and the Scribes murmured, saying: This man receiveth sinners, and eateth with them. And He spoke to them this parable, saying: What man of you that hath an hundred sheep, and if he shall lose one of them, doth he not leave the ninety-nine in the desert, and go after that which was lost, until he find it? And when he hath found it, lay it upon his shoulders, rejoicing: and coming home, call together his friends and neighbours, saying to them: Rejoice with me, because I have found my sheep that was lost? I say to you, that even so there shall be joy in heaven upon one sinner that doth penance, more than upon ninety-nine just who need not penance. Or what woman having ten groats, if she lose one groat, doth not light a candle, and sweep the house, and seek diligently until she find it? And when she hath found it, call together her friends and neighbours, saying: Rejoice with me, because I have found the groat which I had lost? So I say to you, there shall be joy before the angels of God upon one sinner doing penance.

Offertory: *Ps. 9:11-12, 13.* Let them trust in Thee who know Thy name, O Lord: for Thou hast not forsaken them that seek Thee. Sing ye to the Lord, Who dwelleth in Sion: for He hath not forgotten the cry of the poor.

Secret: Look down, O Lord, upon the offerings of Thy suppliant Church; and grant that they may avail unto the salvation of the faithful who receive them, through their perpetual sanctification. Through our Lord.

Communion: *Luke 15:10.* I say to you, there is joy before the angels of God upon one sinner doing penance.

Postcommunion: May Thy holy mysteries which we have received give us life, O Lord; and, having cleansed us, prepare us, being purified, for Thine everlasting mercy. Through our Lord.

FALÒ DI SAN GIOVANNI – KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS:

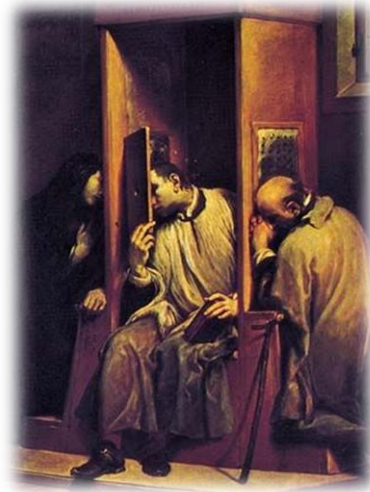
“He must increase, but I must decrease” (John 3:30)

To All Our Guests:

Canon Hellmann and the faithful of St. Josaphat Oratory welcome you, and hope that this visit—whether it be your first or your only—may be an opportunity to experience the riches and beauty of the perennial tradition of the Roman Catholic faith, expressed in the classical Roman Liturgy.

Without worrying about making perfect sense of everything or following along word-for-word in your missal or booklet, rather enjoy the beauty of this liturgy, which has produced countless generations of saints and which defines and governs the life of our Institute and all its members: priest-cansons, seminarians, oblates, and Sister Adorers.

In keeping with liturgical tradition in the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite, Holy Communion is received on the tongue and, if you are able, kneeling. Visitors who are not Roman Catholic are welcome to join us in prayer but are requested not to receive Holy Communion. Because the reception of Holy Communion is the expression of complete union with God and His Church, only practicing Catholics who are in full communion with the Catholic Church and free from mortal sin should present themselves to receive. We pray for the full, visible unity of all Christians.

To receive more information about the Oratory, or if you desire to become a member of the Catholic Church, please contact the Rectory. St. Josaphat Oratory is an apostolate of the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest in the Diocese of Brooklyn, New York.

SACRAMENTS

Baptism: Please contact the Oratory in advance. Infants should be baptized within the first few weeks after birth (Code of Canon Law, 867 §1).

First Penance and First Holy Communion: For instruction, please contact the Rectory.

Marriage: Please contact the Oratory at least six months in advance.

Extreme Unction (Anointing of the Sick) is to be received by a Catholic in a life-threatening condition due to accident, illness or old age. Please call the Rectory immediately.

ORGANIZATIONS AT THE ORATORY

The Carmelite Oblates meet on the first Saturday of every month, after Holy Mass, and host a public Holy Face Devotion on the 3rd Sunday of every month at 3:00 pm in the Oratory.

Padre Pio Prayer Group meets on the 1st Tuesday of every month. (Mass in the Ordinary Form, at 7:00 pm).

The Knights of Columbus Agnus Dei Council (#12361) special charism is their attachment to the Traditional Latin Mass. The knights meet every 3rd Sunday of the month. Interested Catholic men may speak to one of the ushers after Mass or come to their table at the convivium in St. Josaphat's Hall.

Legion of Mary is a lay Catholic group serving Our Lady through prayer and works of mercy. We meet every Monday night at 5:15 pm.

The Right to Life Committee meets the 2nd Thursday of the month (except July and August) at 7:30 pm.
