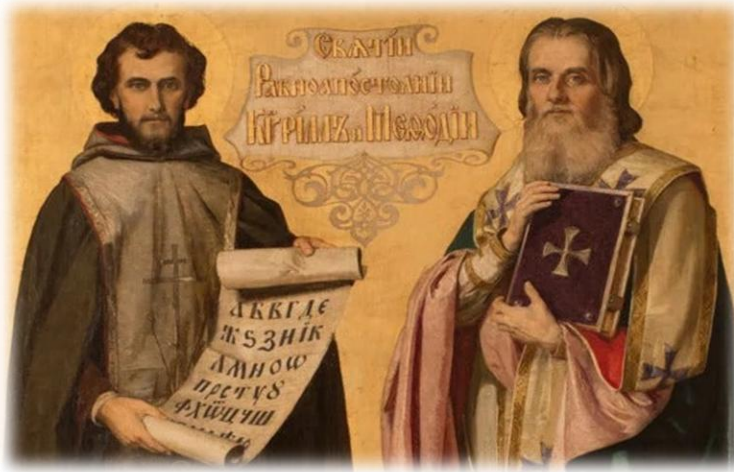

PROPERs – 6TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST



The Multiplication of the Loaves and Fishes, Flemish School, 17th cent.

Introit *Ps. 27: 8, 9:* The Lord is the strength of His people, and the protector of the salvation of His anointed: save, O Lord, Thy people, and bless Thine inheritance, and rule them for ever. *Ps. 27: 1.* Unto Thee will I cry, O Lord: O my God, be not Thou silent to me, lest if Thou be silent to me, I become like them that go down into the pit. Glory be to the Father.

Collect: O God of hosts, to Whom all that is best belong, graft in our hearts the love of Thy name, and grant us an increase of true religion: that Thou mayest foster what is good, and with tender zeal guard what Thou hast fostered. Through our Lord.

Epistle *Romans 6: 3-11:* Brethren, all we who are baptized in Christ Jesus are baptized in His death. For we are buried together with Him by baptism unto death; that as Christ is risen from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we also may walk in newness of life. For if we have been planted together in the likeness of His death, we shall also be in the likeness of His Resurrection. Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with Him, that the body of sin may be destroyed, and that we may serve sin no longer. For he that is dead is justified from sin. Now if ye be dead with Christ, we believe that we shall live also together with Christ. Knowing that Christ, rising again from the dead, dieth now no more, death shall no more have dominion over Him. For in that He died to sin, He died once; but in that He liveth, He liveth unto God. So do you also reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin, but alive to God; in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Gradual *Ps. 89: 13, 1:* Return, O Lord: a little; and be entreated in favour of Thy servants. *V.* Lord, Thou hast been our refuge from generation to generation.

Alleluia *Ps. 30: 2-3:* Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* In Thee, O Lord, have I hoped, let me never be confounded: deliver me in Thy justice, and release me: bow down Thine ear to me, make haste to deliver me. Alleluia.

Gospel *Mark 8: 1-9:* At that time, when there was a great multitude with Jesus, and they had nothing to eat, calling His disciples together, He saith to them: I have compassion on the multitude, for behold they have now been with Me three days, and have nothing to eat; and if I shall send them away fasting to their home, they will faint in the way: for some of them came from afar off. And His disciples answered Him: From whence can any one fill them here with bread in the wilderness? And He asked them: How many loaves have ye? Who said: Seven. And He commanded the people to sit down on the ground. And taking the seven loaves, giving thanks, He broke and gave to His disciples to set before the people. And they had a few little fishes, and He blessed them, and commanded them to be set before them. And they did eat, and were filled; and they took up that which was left of the fragments, seven baskets: and they that had eaten were about four thousand: and He sent them away.

Offertory *Ps. 16: 5, 6, 7:* Perfect Thou my goings in Thy paths, that my footsteps be not moved: incline Thy ear, and hear my words: show forth Thy wonderful mercies, Thou who savest them that trust in Thee, O Lord.

Secret: Be appeased, O Lord, by our supplications, and graciously accept these offerings of Thy people: neither suffering the hope of anyone to be in vain, nor his prayer to remain unheard, that we may obtain that for which we faithfully pray. Through our Lord.

Communion *Ps. 26: 6:* I will go round, and offer up in His tabernacle a sacrifice of jubilation: I will sing, and recite a psalm to the Lord.

Postcommunion: Grant, O Lord, that we who have been filled with Thy gifts, may be cleansed by their virtue and strengthened by their help. Through our Lord.

Canon Hellmann and the faithful of St. Josaphat Oratory welcome you, and hope that this visit—whether it be your first or your only—may be an opportunity to experience the riches and beauty of the perennial tradition of the Roman Catholic faith, expressed in the classical Roman Liturgy.

Without worrying about making perfect sense of everything or following along word-for-word in your missal or booklet, rather enjoy the beauty of this liturgy, which has produced countless generations of saints and which defines and governs the life of our Institute and all its members: priest-canon, seminarians, oblates, and Sister Adorers.

In keeping with liturgical tradition in the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite, Holy Communion is received on the tongue and, if you are able, kneeling. Visitors who are not Roman Catholic are welcome to join us in prayer but are requested not to receive Holy Communion. Because the reception of Holy Communion is the expression of complete union with God and His Church, only practicing Catholics who are in full communion with the Catholic Church and free from mortal sin should present themselves to receive. We pray for the full, visible unity of all Christians.

SACRAMENTS

Baptism: Please contact the Oratory in advance. Infants should be baptized within the first few weeks after birth (Code of Canon Law, 867 §1).

First Penance and First Holy Communion: For instruction, please contact the Rectory.

Marriage: Please contact the Oratory at least six months in advance.

Extreme Unction (Anointing of the Sick) is to be received by a Catholic in a life-threatening condition due to accident, illness or old age. Please call the Rectory immediately.
