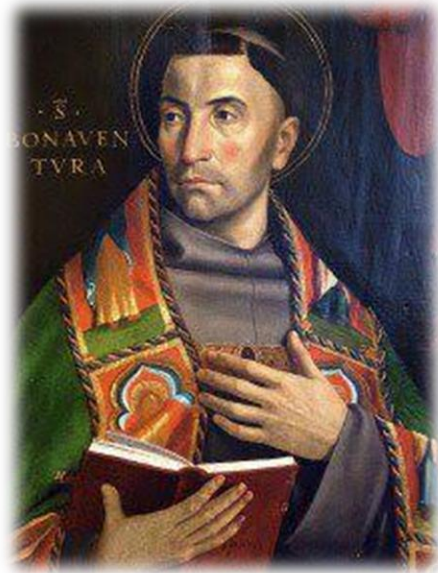

PROPERs – 7TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST



Christ, the True Vine, by Anonymous c. 16th cent.

Introit Ps. 46: 2: Clap your hands, all ye nations: shout unto God with the voice of joy. Ps. 46: 3. For the Lord is most high, He is terrible; He is a great King over all the earth. Glory be to the Father.

Collect: O God, whose providence faileth not in its designs, we humbly entreat Thee, to put away from us all hurtful things, and to give us all things which be profitable for us. Through our Lord.

Epistle Romans 6: 19-23: Brethren, I speak a human thing, because of the infirmity of your flesh: for as you have yielded your members to serve uncleanness and iniquity unto iniquity, so now yield your members to serve justice unto sanctification. For when you were the servants of sin, you were free from justice. What

fruit therefore had you then in those things, of which you are now ashamed? For the end of them is death. But now being made free from sin, and become servants to God, you have your fruit unto sanctification, and the end life everlasting. For the wages of sin is death. But the grace of God, life everlasting, in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Gradual *Ps. 33: 12, 6:* Come, children, hearken to me: I will teach you the fear of the Lord. *℣.* Come ye to Him and be enlightened: and your faces shall not be confounded.

Alleluia *Ps. 46: 2:* Alleluia, alleluia. *℣.* O clap your hands, all ye nations: shout unto God with the voice of joy. Alleluia.

Gospel *Matthew 7: 15-21:* At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: Beware of false prophets, who come to you in the clothing of sheep, but inwardly they are ravening wolves. By their fruits you shall know them. Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles? Even so every good tree bringeth forth good fruit, and the evil tree bringeth forth evil fruit. A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can an evil tree bring forth good fruit. Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit shall be cut down, and shall be cast

into the fire. Wherefore by their fruits you shall know them. Not every one that saith to Me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven: but he that doth the will of My Father who is in heaven, he shall enter into the kingdom of heaven.

Offertory *Daniel 3: 40:* As in holocausts of rams and bullocks, and as in thousands of fat lambs: so let our sacrifice be made in Thy sight this day, that it may please Thee: for there is no confusion to them that trust in Thee, O Lord.

Secret: O God, who by the perfection of one sacrifice hast put an end to the diversity of the sacrifices of the Law: receive the sacrifice from Thy devoted servants, and sanctify it with a like blessing to that wherewith Thou didst bless the offerings of Abel; that what each one hath offered to the honour of Thy Majesty, may profit unto the salvation of all. Through our Lord.

Communion *Ps. 30: 3:* Bow down Thine ear to me, make haste to deliver me.

Postcommunion: May Thy healing operation, O Lord, mercifully both deliver us from our perverse inclinations, and lead us to those things that are right. Through our Lord.

Canon Hellmann and the faithful of St. Josaphat Oratory welcome you, and hope that this visit—whether it be your first or your only—may be an opportunity to experience the riches and beauty of the perennial tradition of the Roman Catholic faith, expressed in the classical Roman Liturgy.

Without worrying about making perfect sense of everything or following along word-for-word in your missal or booklet, rather enjoy the beauty of this liturgy, which has produced countless generations of saints and which defines and governs the life of our Institute and all its members: priest-canons, seminarians, oblates, and Sister Adorers.

In keeping with liturgical tradition in the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite, Holy Communion is received on the tongue and, if you are able, kneeling. Visitors who are not Roman Catholic are welcome to join us in prayer but are requested not to receive Holy Communion. Because the reception of Holy Communion is the expression of complete union with God and His Church, only practicing Catholics who are in full communion with the Catholic Church and free from mortal sin should present themselves to receive. We pray for the full, visible unity of all Christians.

SACRAMENTS

Baptism: Please contact the Oratory in advance. Infants should be baptized within the first few weeks after birth (Code of Canon Law, 867 §1).

First Penance and First Holy Communion: For instruction, please contact the Rectory.

Marriage: Please contact the Oratory at least six months in advance.

Extreme Unction (Anointing of the Sick) is to be received by a Catholic in a life-threatening condition due to accident, illness or old age. Please call the Rectory immediately.
