PROPERs – 8TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Introit *Ps. 47: 10, 11*: We have received Thy mercy, O God, in the midst of Thy temple: according to Thy name, O God, so also is Thy praise unto the ends of the earth: Thy right hand is full of justice. *Ps. 47: 2*. Great is the Lord, and exceedingly to be praised, in the city of our God, in His holy mountain. Glory be to the Father.

Collect: Grant to us, O Lord, we beseech Thee, the spirit to think and do always such things as are right; that we, who cannot exist without Thee, may be able to live according to Thy will. Through our Lord.

Epistle *Romans 8: 12-17*: Brethren, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh. For if you live according to the flesh, you shall die: but if by the Spirit you mortify the deeds of the flesh, you shall live. For whosoever are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God. For you have not received the spirit of bondage again in fear; but you have received the spirit of adoption of sons, whereby we cry: Abba (Father). For the Spirit Himself giveth testimony to our spirit, that we are the sons of God. And if sons, heirs also; heirs indeed of God, and joint heirs with Christ.

Gradual *Ps. 30: 3; 70: 1*: Be Thou unto me a God, a protector, and a place of refuge, to save me. *V*. In Thee, O God, have I hoped: O Lord, let me never be confounded.

Alleluia *Ps. 47: 2*: Alleluia, alleluia. *V*. Great is the Lord, and exceedingly to be praised, in the city of our God, in His holy mountain. Alleluia.

Gospel *Luke 16: 1-9*: At that time, Jesus spoke to His disciples this parable: There was a certain rich man who had a steward: and the same was accused unto him, that he had wasted his goods. And he called him, and said to him: How is it that I hear this of thee? give

an account of thy stewardship: for now thou canst be steward no longer. And the steward said within himself: What shall I do, because my lord taketh away from me the stewardship? To dig I am not able; to beg I am ashamed. I know what I will do, that when I shall be removed from the stewardship, they may receive me into their houses. Therefore calling together every one of his lord's debtors, he said to the first: How much dost thou owe my lord? But he said: A hundred barrels of oil. And he said to him: Take thy bill and sit down quickly, and write fifty. Then he said to another: And how much dost thou owe? Who said: A hundred quarters of wheat. He said to him: Take thy bill, and write eighty. And the lord commended the unjust steward, forasmuch as he had done wisely: for the children of this world are wiser in their generation than the children of light. And I say to you: Make unto you friends of the mammon of iniquity; that when you shall fail, they may receive you into everlasting dwellings.

Offertory *Ps. 17: 28, 32*: Thou wilt save the humble people, O Lord, and wilt bring down the eyes of the proud: for who is God but Thee, O Lord?

Secret: Accept, we beseech Thee, O Lord, the gifts of Thine own bounty, which we bring Thee: that these holy and sacred Mysteries, by the working of the power of Thy grace, may sanctify us in our conduct of this present life, and bring us to everlasting joys. Through our Lord.

Communion *Ps. 33: 9*: Taste and see that the Lord is sweet: blessed is the man that hopeth in Him.

Postcommunion: May this heavenly Mystery be to us, O Lord, for the renewal of mind and body: that we may enjoy the fruits of that which we celebrate. Through our Lord.

To All Our Guests:

Canon Hellmann and the faithful of St. Josaphat Oratory welcome you, and hope that this visit—whether it be your first or your only—may be an opportunity to experience the riches and beauty of the perennial tradition of the Roman Catholic faith, expressed in the classical Roman Liturgy.

Without worrying about making perfect sense of everything or following along word-for-word in your missal or booklet, rather enjoy the beauty of this liturgy, which has produced countless generations of saints and which defines and governs the life of our Institute and all its members: priest-canon, seminarians, oblates, and Sister Adorers.

In keeping with liturgical tradition in the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite, Holy Communion is received on the tongue and, if you are able, kneeling. Visitors who are not Roman Catholic are welcome to join us in prayer but are requested not to receive Holy Communion. Because the reception of Holy Communion is the expression of complete union with God and His Church, only practicing Catholics who are in full communion with the Catholic Church and free from mortal sin should present themselves to receive. We pray for the full, visible unity of all Christians.

SACRAMENTS

Baptism: Please contact the Oratory in advance. Infants should be baptized within the first few weeks after birth (Code of Canon Law, 867 §1).

First Penance and First Holy Communion: For instruction, please contact the Rectory.

Marriage: Please contact the Oratory at least six months in advance.

Extreme Unction (Anointing of the Sick) is to be received by a Catholic in a life-threatening condition due to accident, illness or old age. Please call the Rectory immediately.
